## Dear Friends and Neighbors,


Since 1955 Weston Forest and Trail, a volunteer-run non-profit, has maintained the *100 miles of trails* on Weston's 2000+ acres of woods and fields. There is no charge for using Weston's open spaces, but to keep the trails open for all requires a significant amount of *effort and money*: clearing trails of fallen trees, building and repairing boardwalks and bridges, opening vistas, marking trails, and monitoring/acquiring easements, restrictions and properties. This work costs about \$100,000 a year.

Weston's open spaces help to provide *clean air and water*, as well a *diverse landscape* for flora and fauna. Even if you are not a frequent trail user, please consider supporting us today!
