Oct 5	Wellington Farm: Step back in time with a tour of the historic district, featuring the 18th-century Gateways Barn, where the old cider press will be in action with refreshments. No Dogs. Park next to the red barn opposite 500 Wellesley St.	Julie Hyde and Nina Danforth
Nov 2	Hubbard Forest and Orchard Avenue: Walk from Burt Field through the Hubbard Forest and into the magical neighborhood of Orchard Avenue, site of what was Weston's third largest estate, owned by Charles Townsend Hubbard in the 1860s. Park at Burt Field (end of Gail Road).	Kristin Barbieri
Dec 7	Sears Land and Melone Homestead: Enjoy a special holiday treat and explore remnants of the old Sears Estate. We will walk over the river and through the woods leaving right from Town Green. Meet at the old watering trough.	Diana Chaplin
Jan 4	Ogilvie Town Forest: We will start in Lincoln and walk in Weston's largest and wildest forest. Park at the trailhead at the end of Stonehedge Road in Lincoln.	Chris Jylkka
Feb 1	Cat Rock and 80 Acres: Celebrate World Wetlands Day with a tour of Hobbs Pond and 80 Acres, including one of the nicest open fields in Weston. Park at the end of Drabbington Way.	Gail Palmer
Mar 1	Nolte Forest: Discover the old stone chimney with hearth among the pine trees. Explore 53 acres of wetlands and forests starting at the trailhead between 7 and 17 Audubon Circle.	Vicki Gifford
Apr 5	<u>College Pond</u> : Certified Forest Therapy Guide Michele Ryan will lead a 2–3 hour meditative "forest bathing" experience—an immersive, restorative way to slow down and reconnect with nature. Leaves from Burchard Park tennis courts.	Michele Ryan
